

RECENT ARCHIVAL ACCESSIONS

CIVILIAN - OFFICIAL PERSONNEL FILES (OPF)

Civilian personnel files for certain federal agencies in which employment ended before December 31, 1951, are now designated as archival records and are open to the public for a fee.

SELECTIVE SERVICE SYSTEM RECORDS

Selective Service System (SSS) Registration and Classification Records for individuals born after September 12, 1873, are now public records and are available for a fee. This record collection includes SSS files that are 30 years old or older (based on the current date).

MICROFILM UNIT RECORDS [MORNING REPORTS AND ROSTERS] FOR ARMY/ARMY AIR CORPS/AIR FORCE COVERING WWI & WWII

- Morning reports are unit records that were filled out each day for the purpose of strength accountability. Morning reports may reflect changes in duty status for personnel assigned to the unit such as gains, losses, leave, transfers, TDY, promotions, etc.
- Rosters contain names of personnel alphabetically by rank, serial number, arm of service, component, date of enlistment, and principal duty.
- These unit records are compiled monthly and become public records 62 years after the month in which they were created. Example: morning reports created April 1, 1945 – April 30, 1945 became public records on May 1, 2007.

Note: Army rosters for the years 1944 – 1946 were destroyed in accordance with the General Records Schedule and are no longer available. Please be advised that our unit records holdings may not be complete.
